He said to them,



# June 25th Day of Reflection





In his talk on Mercy, Fr. Tom West, OFM, reflected on this Year of Mercy offered by Pope Francis. He gave us several names of those who have given their thoughts on God's Divine Mercy. One name was Cardinal Walter Kasper. Here is what was said in the introduction of Commonweal Magazine of their Interview with Cardinal Walter Kasper - During his first Angelus address, Pope Francis recommended a work of theology that "has done me so much good" because it "says that mercy changes everything; it changes the world by making it less cold and more fair." That book is Mercy: The Essence of the Gospel and the Key to Christian Life by Cardinal Walter Kasper....

Another name offered was Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM, a Franciscan priest of the New Mexico Province and founder of the Center for Action and Contemplation (CAC) in Albuquerque, New Mexico. He has authored many books one of which, <u>Falling Upward</u> which as a fraternity, we chose to read and discuss for our ongoing formation. It's when we pick ourselves up after a great fall that we find ourselves growing spiritually.

Eckert Tolle was another name mentioned, Tolle writes in the introduction to his second book, Stillness Speaks: "A true spiritual teacher does not have anything to teach in the



conventional sense of the word, does not have anything to give or add to you, such as new information, beliefs, or rules of conduct. The only function of such a teacher is to help you remove that which separates you from the truth ... The words are no more than signposts."

Tolle writes that "the most significant thing that can happen to a human being [is] the separation process of thinking and awareness" and that awareness is "the space in which thoughts exist". Tolle says that "the primary cause of unhappiness is never the situation but your thoughts about it". Fr Tom helped us to explore the concept of this inner place, where we co-exist with the divine.

According to Tolle's official website, "at the core of Tolle's teachings lies the transformation of consciousness, a spiritual awakening that he sees as the next step in human evolution. An essential aspect of this awakening consists in transcending our ego-based state of consciousness. This is a prerequisite not only for personal happiness but also for the ending of violent conflict endemic on our planet".

In his book A New Earth, Tolle describes a major aspect of the human dysfunction as "ego" or an "illusory sense of self" based on unconscious identification with one's memories and thoughts, and another major aspect he calls "pain-body" or "an accumulation of old emotional pain".

Others who were mentioned for their contributions of understanding Mercy as a human condition were St Augustine, St Paul, St John of the Cross, John Main, Dom Laurence Freeman, OSB, and Anthony De Mello.

Thank you, Father Tom, for your talk for us to reflect on as we continue on our spiritual journey. Some things for us to take away are to remember to not just read scripture, but to pray it. It's not meant to be dwelt upon, but to be experienced from the heart. This will help to develop true relationships with our Brothers and Sisters in Christ through our understanding of what it means to be Merciful, through Faithfulness, Compassion, Empathy, and most of all LOVE.



## Care for Creation/Newman Center Project

Fr. John Boettcher, OFS appreciates our efforts in planting and caring for the garden. However, he has let us know that his bigger interest is having a place for students and people to come on spiritual retreat for any portion of the day. He presented us with a layout design of the 1.3 acre property to help with developing ideas to help create an environment open to spiritual reflection. Proposals for creating an area where a half dozen individuals could go and feel that they are able to have some time for prayer and reflection with little or no interruption is what I sense Fr. John would like to have for the SSU Newman Center.

Irrigation is going into place to help with this. So suggestions would be much appreciated for the placement of trees, shrubs, flowers, edible landscaping with raised beds around benches, prayer booths, outdoor chapel, etc. Suggestions have also included a labyrinth path, a stations of the cross, and a running fountain to help create an atmosphere for a spiritual retreat center.

Noreen has a landscape gardener in mind to help with preparing and placement of plants when the design has been agreed upon.

August 28<sup>th</sup> is the meeting date for II Poverello elections of new council members. All professed members are urged to attend this important meeting. The meeting will take place in Rm. 9 of the St. Jame's Hall from 1:30 to 3:30.
