July Minister's Letter

Blessed are the quarterbacks?!

Friday it was announced that Derek Carr, football quarterback for the Raiders, signed a contract worth a collective \$125 MILLION over five years. That's \$25 million per year – to play football; or, as he states on his Twitter page, "What they call work, I call worship!"

I can't speak for the Almighty, but let me try . . . "Are you KIDDING me?!"

I know Carr is not alone in the sports fields (football, baseball, basketball and more) to take in sums of money most of us can only spend all day thinking of ways to spend (wisely, of course!), but to Tweet "Blessed!!!" in announcing this contract, even as a self-described "Follower of Jesus Christ" (again, Twitter) he must have a different view of what it means to "worship" God than do I. While I hope Carr indeed takes his Christian call to heart, and "sells all to follow Jesus" (okay, almost all!), it is hard for us to proclaim messages of justice, peace and hope in a world that openly acts like God himself wrote that check just for me!

Jesus reminds us that it is the least - period! — who are truly blessed, and for reasons that are against the message of our consumerist society. I confess that I enjoy professional sports as much as anyone, and have spent perhaps too much on a ticket or beverage. But I don't feel that this was my contribution to the "worship" happening on the field. Rather, I see windfalls like this — and we all experience gifts and surprises at times — as a chance to truly worship God, and give back generously from what we have reaped. To be a religious in a secular world means we need paychecks, for ourselves and our families. But when the amount is far beyond what anyone truly needs to be safe, sheltered and fed, then we need to do some serious soul-searching. Perhaps we won't do as Francis did, and strip naked and give back even our clothes, but I think that the spirit is calling the signs if we listen in the noise of the huddle— and with God as our quarterback, how can we lose?!

And he spoke to them at length in parables, saying:


"A sower went out to sow. And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and birds came and ate it up.

Sr. Margie Will, OSF, led *Il Poverello* fraternity members in a loving conversation about our Holy Mother Mary, Theotokos: God Bearer. We pondered the Virgin Mary as our model of fruitful and faithful love for the entire ecclesial community. We spent time on the qualities of Mary: Humble Servant, Openness, Complete Self-Giving (she said YES, "Let it be done unto me"), Fruitful and Faithful love, Earnest and Confident Prayer, Welcoming the Spirit, Poverty and Simplicity, and Obedience. It is an apostolic task of the Church to rightly look to the one who bore Christ, Christ who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin in order that He might also be born and grow in the hearts of the faithful. We ask, "What do I need in order to give birth to Christ?"

<u>John 19: 26, 27</u> When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home.
