Minister's Letter - May 2017

A Franciscan Mother's Day . . .

May presents us with a couple of chances to celebrate the meaning and reality of the role of mothers in all our lives. First, of course, is the national celebration of mothers in Mothers' Day – although we are not alone, as over 40 countries worldwide currently honor mothers in some similar way! In this day, we celebrate that person in our life who has guided us and loves us, and will all too willingly remind us how much else she has done for us through the years. While the role of motherhood is changing in ways, and some children know not much of such a person in their lives, those of us blessed to have had a maternal person in our formative years and into adulthood are reminded annually of all we have received from our mother. In faith, Mary is honored not only in our own tradition of faith, but is also held in special attention in other faiths – in Islam, as an example, Mary holds an unusually exalted place as the only woman named in the Qur'an, where she is referenced seventy times, and is declared the greatest of all women, with reference to the angelic salutation during the annunciation, "O Mary, God has chosen you, and purified you; He has chosen you above all the women of creation." The nineteenth chapter of the scripture, the Chapter of Mary (Surat Maryam), is named after her, and she is mentioned in the Quran more times than the entire New Testament! So, while these tidbits provide food for thought, we know that in our religious tradition Francis held Mary in great esteem as well. And secondly, we also have the chance this month to gather in fraternity for a day and reflect on the role of Mary, the mom of Yeshua, as we engage with Sister Margie Will, OSF and explore what Mary holds for us Franciscans. He held Mary in love for the fact that she, as we noted, was the vessel by which God took on humanity. The incarnational birth was for Francis a great – if not greatest – gift of God to us, and this he reflected in his desire to bring the nativity scene to life one year. The openness and humbleness (humility) of Mary to say "yes," when she did have a choice in the matter, was for Francis a stance to embrace, one where we too can say "yes" to God being born in our own human stable of the heart. It is truly the heart of all mothers, in any country, faith or family, which brings us to life. Literally, and in our spiritual lives, may we grow to echo the original "yes" to the life our mothers offered to us so joyfully - for in them and through their love we know not only the love of our families, but the love of our brother Jesus and our "Father/Mother" Creator, God. May all mothers be blessed this month and always, in their ministry of life and love.

John 14:7-14

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you know me, then you will also know my Father. From now on you do know him and have seen him."

Philip said to Jesus,

"Have I been with you for so long a time and you still do not know me, Philip? Whoever has seen me has seen the Father. How can you say, 'Show us the Father'?

Do you not believe that I am in the Father and the Father is in me? The words that I speak to you I do not speak on my own. The Father who dwells in me is doing his works. Believe me that I am in the Father and the Father is in me, or else, believe because of the works themselves.

Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever believes in me will do the works that I do, and will do greater ones than these, because I am going to the Father. And whatever you ask in my name, I will do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."



# The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order

As Secular Franciscans we are constantly challenged to mindfully follow the rule of St Francis

- Rule 11 -

Trusting the Father, Christ chose for Himself and His mother a poor and humble life, even though the valued created things attentively and lovingly. Let the Secular Franciscans seek a proper spirit of detachment from temporal goods by simplifying their own material needs. Let them be mindful that according to the gospel they are stewards of the goods received for the benefit of God's children.

Thus, in the spirit of the Beatitudes, and as pilgrims and strangers on their way to the home of the Father, they should strive to purify their hearts from every tendency and yearning for possession and power.

## Pope Francis' prayer intentions for the month of May:

That Christians in Africa, in imitation of the Merciful Jesus, may give prophetic witness to reconciliation, justice, and peace.

### Pope Francis has remarked of the Christians in Africa:

"We are well aware that the recent events and acts of violence which have shaken your country were not grounded in properly religious motives. Those who claim to believe in God must also be men and women of peace. Christians, Muslims and members of the traditional religions have lived together in peace for many years. They ought, therefore, to remain united in working for an end to every act which, from whatever side, disfigures the Face of God. Together, we must say no to hatred, no to revenge and no to violence, particularly that violence which is perpetrated in the name of a religion or of God himself."

"We must work and pray and do everything possible for peace. But without love, without friendship, without tolerance, without forgiveness, peace is not possible."

Praying for African Christians, we commit ourselves to imitating the Merciful Jesus and giving prophetic witness to reconciliation, justice, and peace in our own lives.

## **Scripture Reflections:**

Luke 24: 33-38: On the cross Jesus did not retaliate, asking the Father to take vengeance and to punish those who crucified him. He asks the Father to forgive them.

**2 Peter 2: 21-25:** Jesus, the only innocent and sinless one, suffered and died on the cross to take away the sins of the world and to bring healing.




