### **Minister's Letter**

Peace and all good.

It appears the Holy Spirit is moving in powerful ways, for our Il Poverello is shaking. Our challenge is to look deeply, reach to Jesus in personal prayer and Eucharist, and open ourselves to the new growth that is calling.

Our candidates have requested honesty and transparency in communication. I offer my following assessment of our situation with their request in mind.

At present, Il Poverello does not have a functional council. Without a functional council, we cannot continue as a fraternity.

In the past year, fraternity members have not been consistent with meeting attendance, have expressed a desire for "less structure" and have been busy with other groups and work.

It appears that one possible solution for our group is to continue as a Franciscan inspired prayer group, eliminating the need to follow the Rule of the Secular Franciscan order.

Commitment to the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order requires ongoing participation in the active life of the Catholic Church, consistent fraternity meeting attendance with active participation, involvement with other Franciscan activities and preferably a fraternity apostolate, and giving the Secular Franciscan Order priority over other activities, with the exception of family needs.

This is presented as a reality check, not a judgment of anyone. Any religious order is demanding for its members, and many of us probably did not realize the truth of the call into a secular order. ("I have been duped, Oh Lord!)

St Francis Fraternity in San Francisco is available for those persons who wish to follow the structure and Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order, and the place of meeting, the Tenderloin district of San Francisco, is truly an inspiration to follow the example of Francis who lived and worked among the very least of his brothers and sisters, seeing Christ in them all.

Our meeting November 22 will be a working meeting to discuss our direction, and hopefully will include visitors from St. Francis Fraternity and the Regional Council. Please continue your prayers and discernment as the work of the Spirit continues.

#### Gospel MT 25:31-46

Jesus said to his disciples:

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit upon his glorious throne, and all the nations will be assembled before him.

And he will separate them one from another, as a shepherd

When did we see you ill or in prison, and visit you?'

And the king will say to them in reply,

'Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of the least brothers of mine, you did for me.'

Then he will say to those on his left,

'Depart from me, you accursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, a stranger and you gave me no welcome,

naked and you gave me no clothing, ill and in prison, and you did not care for me.'

Then they will answer and say,

'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or naked or ill or in prison, and not minister to your needs?'

He will answer them.

'Amen, I say to you, what you did not do for one of these least ones, you did not do for me.' And these will go off to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."

## The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order

As Secular Franciscans we are constantly challenged to mindfully follow the rule of St Francis

- Rule 5 -

Secular Franciscans, therefore, should seek to encounter the living and active person of Christ in their brothers and sisters, in Sacred Scripture, in the Church, and in liturgical activity. The faith of St. Francis, who often said, "I see nothing bodily of the Most High Son of God in this world except his most holy body and blood," should be the inspiration and pattern of their Eucharistic life.



## We pray to the Lord...


